



COVID-19 SCREENING QUESTIONS

To All Courthouse Visitors:

If you –

- Have flu-like symptoms now or within the last 3 days; or
- Have tested positive for COVID within the last 5 days, or have been directed to quarantine, isolate or self-monitor at home for COVID by any doctor hospital or health agency; or
- Have had close contact with a person testing positive for COVID within the past 5 days (unless you are fully vaccinated and have received a booster; have received the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine in the last 6 months or the J&J vaccine in the last 2 months; or have recovered from COVID within the past 3 months*); or
- Have returned from international travel within the last 10 days (unless you have recovered from COVID within the past 3 months, are fully vaccinated or have returned 8-10 days ago and have received a negative viral COVID test 3-5 days after your return**).

* If you are covered by this close contact exemption, please be prepared to provide proof of vaccination(s).

** If you are covered by this international travel exemption, please be prepared to provide proof of vaccination, recent recovery from COVID or your test results.

YOU SHOULD NOT ENTER THE COURTHOUSE.

Instead, please call your attorney (if you are represented) or please call the court that you were reporting to (if you do not have a lawyer) and report your situation. If you have a scheduled appearance or were otherwise directed to attend court today, you will not be penalized for your absence provided you contact the court or your attorney contacts the court.

We thank you for your cooperation in this effort to prevent the spread of COVID-19 (coronavirus) to others in the community.
