Spent several days working on paperwork and submittals for the ARPA (Covid) funding that we received in 2021. There have been semi annual reports that I submitted on the U.S. Treasury website describing and affirming what those funds were used for. We received \$133,948.22 which was all used to offset construction costs for the new highway storage building. In late April I received notification that I had to submit paperwork (that was already submitted) or the Town was going to have to refund those funds back to the U.S. Treasury. We discussed this at the meeting of Otsego County Supervisor's meeting and many other Supervisors were dealing with the same situation. I called MVEDD for assistance navigating the Treasury website and I was successful in submitting all documentation. I received email and written verification from Treasury that Butternuts information is now accepted, and I will have to file one more report next year to finalize the process.

I will be attending the "Greenhouse Gas Inventories Kickoff" meeting next week at the Meadows complex on Cooperstown. This is to begin the process for becoming a "climate Smart Community". I submitted our MOU over a year ago for this program and we finally have a contract with NYSDEC to proceed. Other towns in this group are Hartwick, Middlefield, Otsego, and Richfield.

Things at the campground have been soggy and not a lot of activity in May and early June. Water test for May was fine, and I brought the water test for June tom the lab yesterday. The chlorinating system has had a few issues but it is working properly now. Reservations for pavilions, tenting and RV sites keep coming in.

I have spoken with Jason Fleming about progress on plans for the new municipal building. He has worked with the architects on a few details but says we need to commit to a few onsite visits to tour some existing town halls. If we can't do that, or no longer want to do that, he will disregard and move forward without any tours.
